Taipei Xia-Hai City God Temple

Following your exploration of Yongle Fabric Market, your New Year walking tour continues to Taipei Xia-Hai City God Temple, established in 1856. This revered temple is dedicated to various deities, including the City God, City God's Wife, Yue Lao, and others. Notably, the temple is renowned for worshiping the famous "matchmaker"—Yue Lao, the God of marriage and love. For those seeking their soulmate, seize the chance to seek Yue Lao's help. Married couples can offer prayers to the City God's Wife for a harmonious and enduring marriage with their better half.

Dihua Street Lunar New Year Market

The skyscraper is adjoined by a multilevel shopping mall—Taipei 101 Mall. The mall houses hundreds of fashionable stores and restaurants, along with a food court and a supermarket. From luxury brands to fast fashion retailers, from Michelin star restaurants to cheap eats, you can always find something for your there.

Din Tai Fung Xiaolongbao Dinner

After that, it's time enjoy a delectable Xiaolongbao dinner at the Michelin Bib Gourmand selected, world-renowned restaurant chain—Din Tai Fung.

Din Tai Fung was founded in Taiwan in 1958, initially a cooking oil retailer, and then transformed to a restaurant serving Xiaolongbao in 1972. Today, the restaurant is renowned for its juicy and savory Xiaolongbao (steamed pork dumplings) that are wrapped with paper-thin dough wrappers and folded exquisitely with 18 perfect folds.

In addition to Xiaolongbao, a number of its signature dishes will be served, such as hot and sour soup, shredded pork fried rice, seasonal vegetable, etc. (menu items are subject to change according to seasonality and availability)

Raohe Street Tourist Night Market

The highest summit of the mountain is approximately 1,120 meters above sea level, where you can enjoy a sweeping view of Taipei Basin when you reach the top of the mountain.

Therefore, Yangmingshan is a great choice for business travelers who need a break from their endless meeting, or people who love to enjoy nature and want to take a break from the busy city life.

Before you travel, you can choose a level of difficulty for your hiking tour. You can choose the Easy Level with the shortest distance to chill and relax on Eziping Trail, or choose the Moderate Level with a longer and steeper trail to sweat a little on Mt. Ding–Mt. Shiti Trail,

and maybe choose the Challenging Level to challenge yourself on Mt. Qixing Trail and get on the highest peak of the mountain. All levels are available for hiking alone or a private group of your friends or family.

On the day of the tour, meet your tour guide at the hotel lobby, then depart to Yangmingshan National Park. Remember to prepare your belongings for the journey according to the level you choose to be able to enjoy the hiking as best as possible. Start hiking along your chosen route

Based on your chosen level, your trip will start and end at different locations in Yangmingshan National Park.

Challenging Level: Mt. Qixing Trail (1.5-2 hours)

This is the most challenging level you can choose from the three trails, which you have the chance to conquer the highest mountain in Taipei—Mt. Qixing. The 4km route starts from Xiaoyoukeng Recreation Area and up to Mt. Qixing. You can enjoy a sweeping view from the mountain top when you reach the main peak of Mt. Qixing. After the challenging section, coming up with a gentle road, and the journey will end at Menghuan Lake, where you can get some rest and relax in the beautiful scenery around the lake.



Moderate Level: Mt. Ding– Shiti Trail (2-2.5 hours)

Starting from Fengguikou, one of the hottest cycling spots in Taipei. But you are not here for cycling. In this level, you will experience a higher and 6 km-long trail with a variety of landscapes and vegetation, such as black forest, mountain ridge and grassland. From Fengguikou to Mt. Ding–Mt. Shiti is a beautiful and leisurely terrain in the eastern part of Yangmingshan National Park. The journey will finish at Qingtiangang Recreation Area, where you can see vast grassy hills and the naturally breed buffaloes.



Easy Level: Erziping Trail (1-1.5 hours)

This easy level will enable you to enjoy a relaxing walk of 3.6 km around Erziping. Paved and shaded, this trail is accessible for people of all ages, and stroller and wheelchair friendly, too. Mt. Miantian and a constructed wetland can be observed along the trail. If you are visiting during the butterfly season, you will have a chance to see many species of butterflies flitting through the trail.

The tour starts with a visit to Sun Moon Lake, the biggest natural lake in Taiwan. The lake is divided by Lalu Island; the east side of the lake resembles the sun while the west side resembles the crescent moon, hence the name. The area around the lake is also the home to the Thao people, a group of Taiwan indigenous peoples. With a rich indigenous culture and abundant natural beauty, Sun Moon Lake has become one of the top-ranked destinations in Taiwan.

Before lunch, you will enjoy a cozy lake cruise by a motorboat that you can fully enjoy the stunning landscapes around you.

After lunch, you head off to the next destination, Taichung. The first stop after your arrival is Miyahara. It was originally an ophthalmology clinic, founded by the Japanese ophthalmologist—Miyahara during Japanese colonization. After the retrocession of Taiwan, the building was taken over by the government, then acquired and renovated by a local pastry

company, which transformed this former eye clinic into a retro-style pastry and ice cream parlor.

Today, Miyahara is widely known for its Hogwarts-alike interior design and various flavors of ice cream. If you are a Harry Potter fan or have a sweet tooth, this place is unmissable.

Hidden in the West District of Taichung City, the Painted Animation Lane has become one of the most photogenic places to snap an Instagram moment thanks to the popularity of Japanese animations. Walking through this colorful alleyway, the scenes of the classic Japanese animations and manga such as "My Neighbor Totoro", "Your Name", "Gundam", "Dragon Ball" and many more, can be spotted on every corner. Whether you are an anime fan or not, strolling through this alley is just like taking a trip back to childhood.

Speaking of the origin of the Painted Animation Lane, it was simply because one of the residents found the walls too boring and monotonous as he repainted the walls, so he painted his favorite anime characters. Soon after, his painting became famous among the neighborhood, and people followed suit one after another, making this originally simple and unadorned alley went viral and become an Instagrammable spot.

In addition to the anime characters painted on the walls, the houses are also worth seeing when you ramble through the alley. The metal roofing, steel doors and window frames, and the brick walls offer a glimpse into the early lifestyle of Taiwanese people.

Your tour continues with a stop at National Taichung Theater, an opera house designed by the famous Japanese architect—Toyo Ito.

The opera house is referred as one of the most difficult architectures to build in the world, because of its curved surfaces. Here you can enjoy a close-up view of this architectural masterpiece, appreciating every detail created with innovative construction methodologies by the master. Even if you are not here for an opera or a musical, the building itself will provide you with an extraordinary experience as you walk through it.

Lastly, before the end of the day, you will visit the biggest night market in Taiwan—Fengjia Night Market.

Even though the night market is always crowded, there is no better way to experience the local culture than visiting a night market. Fengchia Night Market is known for a wide variety of street food, including the locals' most beloved, such as Taiwanese popcorn chicken, sausage with sticky rice, stinky tofu, papaya milk, bubble tea, etc, will make you drool. In addition to the food, the clothing and accessories here are also trendy and fairly priced.

The first stop on the day is Chung-she Flower Garden, also known as Chungshe Flower Market. The vast and colorful garden covers 6 hectares, featuring hundreds of thousands flowering plants, such as tulips, sunflowers, calla lilies, roses and many more. From January to December, there are always beautiful flowers blooming in the garden. Whenever you come to visit, it will never cease to amaze you.

In addition to the fascinating flower beds, there are gorgeous installations like swing chairs, floral arches, the replicas of piano and windmills, etc, which are perfect for photo shooting.



After that, enjoy a "wild" day in Leofoo Village Theme Park, one of the most popular amusement parks in Taiwan. The park features 4 areas: the Wild West, South Pacific, Arabian Palace and African Tribe. The Water Park is open during the summer time. The South Pacific is where the visitors can experience many exciting and thrill rides featuring South Pacific and the age of dinosaurs; the Great Pirate is the biggest pirate ship ride in Taiwan.



The Arabian Palace will take you on an Arabian journey with the immersive rides featuring "One Thousand and One Nights", as if the well-known bedtime stories come to life.



The Wild West is designed based on the Tombstone Town in Arizona State in North America, a famous mining town in the 19th century. Besides the exciting rides and the VR experience, you will soak in the atmosphere of America's old western town.



The African Tribe is the only safari zoo in Taiwan, where a wide range of more than 70 species and over a thousand wild animals can be seen.



After an extremely fun day, you will head back to your hotel or designated drop-off place in downtown Taipei with precious memories.
